



## Reporting Highways problems

Cornwall Council has the responsibility of maintaining the public highways, this includes:

- **Potholes**
- Street light/lamps – not working or columns/mountings damage
- Debris – loose stone or other material
- Gullies and gratings – blocked, missing, damaged or rocking
- Kerbs – damaged or rocking
- Scaffolds – dangerous, unlicensed, unlit or causing obstruction
- Manhole covers - damaged, missing or rocking
- Mud
- Obstructions – items blocking the highway
- Signs – any sign on or off highway
- Surface defects – cracked or rocking slabs
- Verges and trees – overgrown, over hanging or dangerous
- Water – flooding, ponding
- Weeds – injurious; knotweed ragwort etc
- Skip defects – not lit or causing obstruction
- Scaffolds – dangerous, unlicensed, unlit or causing obstruction
